1st Page Intro

How to Read Page 1:

____, It asks the question here “What is eternal life?” and it states here that “eternal life is knowing Jesus!” Jesus said “And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent.”

“____, in this passage Jesus tells us that He doesn't just want us to know about Him, but that He wants us to know Him personally. Well what does knowing Jesus mean?”

1st, to confess Jesus as **Lord**

And **2nd** to believe that God the Father **Raise Him physically** from the dead

The Apostle Paul Wrote in the Bible “If you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, **YOU SHALL BE SAVED.**”

After reading:

Jesus said: “I came that you might have life and might have it abundantly. . . .”

Then say

“Concerning that abundant life, Jesus said. . .

μετανοέω *metanoēō* meaning *to repent*

ἀρσενοκοίτης *arsenokoites* meaning *homosexual*, a male who has sexual intercourse with other males. from ἄρσεν *arsen* meaning *male*, & κοίτη *koitey* meaning *sexual intercourse*. Together they mean a male having sexual intercourse with another male.

How to Present page 11:

*The Bible talks about two kinds of people: **Self-Controlled (Point to it)** and **Christ-Controlled (Point to it)**. A self-controlled person is a person who is motivated and controlled through their soul, their intellect and feelings **(Point to the mind)** and through their flesh their appetite and desires **(point to the belly)** which often times results in discord, disharmony and frustration. This is symbolized by these different dots here **(point to the dots)**. The cross **(point to the cross)** represents Jesus knocking **(hold up your fist and knock)** saying He would like to come in, but God is a gentleman, He will not just force His way into a person's life.*

*The person on the right **(point to the person on the right)** represents a Christ-controlled life. This person by an act of his own free will has responded to Jesus' invitation **(point to the big cross on left)** and has invited Jesus Christ into his life **(point to the cross in the person on the right)** and placed Him on the throne **(point to cross in person right)**, the control center of his life. As a result, a Christ-controlled person is a person who is motivated and controlled by Jesus through their human spirit **(point to human spirit in person right)**. These dots **(point to dots)** which are now in an ordered pattern does not mean that this person does not have problems, everybody in life has problems. What they symbolize are that as this person puts his trust in Jesus Christ not only for salvation **(point to cross in person right)**, but as he seeks His counsel concerning the separate individual areas of his life **(as you point from left to right to each dot)** that it results in harmony with God's purpose and plans for his life despite his problems.*

_____, if you were to place yourself between one of these two people, which of these two people spiritually would you say best represents your life?

***Person witnessed to:** The person on the left.*

***Witness:** Which person would you like to have represent your life?*

***Person witnessed to:** The person on the right.*

After reading off book:

“Evangelism: the Time Is Now!”

Then say:

“These books can be purchased at the website listed on the back page (show page) of this tract. But what I would like to do is give you a free copy of this book titled ‘Jesus Is the Answer to Your Needs.’ This is because this book will give you

1. **assurance of salvation,**
2. **It will explain to you how to relate to Jesus in prayer for the answer to your needs,**
3. **How to know what is truly Jesus’ voice,**
4. **How to know what is His will and plan for Your life,**
5. **And how to succeed in that plan.**

I encourage you to start reading this right away.”

After reading:

“Second, to Grow in Jesus You Need to Become an *Active Part* of a fellowship of Christians.”

The Bible Teaches: Hebrews 10:24-25 “And let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more, as you see the day drawing near.”

Then ask:

“Do you have a church?”

If the person says “No” say:

“I just want you to know you are more than welcome to come and worship Jesus with us. I have a church brochure here (**which you should have with you**) which lists the times of the Church services (**as you hand it to the person**). . .”

Plan to take them with you if they are open to that.

After covering the first point “Unashamed Public Confession of Jesus as Savior and Lord,” say to the person:

“It is real important that when you go home today you share with someone what you did today: that you received Jesus as Your Savior and have surrendered yourself to Him as Lord.”

Then start the page over reading through all the points including this one.
